

# MACROFUNGI CHECKLIST FOR THE INTERMOUNTAIN REGION

(Utah, Nevada, and parts of Wyoming, Idaho, Arizona, and Colorado)

## INTRODUCTION

This checklist came about in response to a number of inquiries from various individuals asking for a list of fungi in Utah and the surrounding area. It is a compilation based on herbarium databases and literature at Utah State University's Intermountain Herbarium by the author, and used for an eventual single volume identification manual aimed at teaching and fieldwork in the region. This work is continuing to evolve and expand as more information is obtained.

## ORGANIZATION

Organized primarily by division and family, and is loosely based on the organizational structure found described by the 9<sup>th</sup> edition of the Dictionary of the Fungi as they are currently understood. Within the families, the genera and species are in alphabetical order. Authors of fungal names are taken from the CABI Bioscience website: [www.indexfungorum.org/Names/Names.ASP](http://www.indexfungorum.org/Names/Names.ASP). There are a small number of genera for which family affiliation is unknown, these are listed under the order to which they belong. All other family affiliations were current at the time the CABI site was consulted.

## NOTE

Species marked in **bold** are known to occur in Utah by herbarium voucher specimens, and are followed by the herbarium code at which the specimen is located.

There is disagreement about the authors of some names. Until these are settled it seemed best to list all the alternatives found.

A list of sources from which this list was drawn from is available from the author as a PDF document, and will be updated as time and circumstances permit. For the source of a specific record, please contact the author at the Intermountain Herbarium. The author welcomes new records based on documented herbarium specimens, especially specimens correctly identified and dried for submission to the Intermountain Herbarium.
